"We get so much more from life when we take care of each other, so I'm honoured to host WE Day Toronto and be a part of such a special day that unites and empowers thousands of young leaders on their journey to make the world a better place."

WE Day Toronto celebrates the remarkable stories of people leading change and provides the youth in attendance, and tens of thousands more watching the event streamed live on www.mtv.ca/weday, inspiration to find their place within the WE Day movement—a movement that celebrates and inspires this generation's shift from me to we. Stories like the journey of Leanne Prendergast, who as a teenager, was worn down by the torment of constant bullying in high school. Throughout her struggles, Leanne contemplated suicide but instead, at her breaking point, turned to her mother for support. Through her mother's advice, Leanne took to writing to share her story. At 14, Leanne and her older sister Laurece co-authored Getting to Know Me, Love Our Lives: Girls Empowering Girls Into Action, shedding firsthand light on the challenges teenage girls face in today's world.

WE Day Toronto host, **Demi Lovato**, will energize the crowd through a day full of powerful educational speeches, inspirational moments and empowering performances. A few must-see moments include:

- Multi-talented recording artist and actor, Nick Jonas, alongside an epic dance crew, energizes the crowd with a performance of his new chart-topping song LEVELS
- Award-winning singer and songwriter, Shawn Mendes, entertains students in attendance with two hit songs. First, a captivating rendition of his chart-topping song, Stitches, followed by a moving collaboration of Never Be Alone with special guests, the Toronto Symphony Youth Orchestra
- Returning to the WE Day stage, Academy® Award-winning actress and devoted social activist, Marlee
 Matlin, shares her personal story about overcoming obstacles, inspiring young people in the crowd to
 face challenges, work hard and turn their dreams into realities

"We believe that, if given the right tools, today's youth can conquer anything they put their minds to. Annually, 200,000 students coast to coast, from over 10,000 schools, earn their tickets to WE Day by creating tangible









benefits for their communities," said WE Day co-founder Craig Kielburger. "By bringing together 20,000 young change-makers today, these students will know that they're not alone and that collectively, they are making their voices heard."

In the 2014/2015 school year, students and educators from across the province participated in remarkable social change. Over 930,000 youth were inspired to take steps to improve the world through WE Schools, volunteering 1.86 million hours for local and global causes and raising \$3.9 million in support of local and global organizations.
